These support children in a variety of ways including developing confidence or self-esteem; dealing with anxiety or anger issues; supporting other emotional needs.</p> <p>Family support worker leads training for families that promotes various parenting skills.</p> <p>‘Smart moves’ are group sessions and will run twice/week. These sessions, led by a teacher assistant, will support children with their gross motor skills, coordination, confidence, relaxing and listening skills.</p> <p>Daily milk to be paid for.</p> <p>Art therapy will support children in expressing their thoughts, emotions and communication through artistic expression.</p>	<p>Children have demonstrated increased confidence and are able to verbalise emotions with more understanding and clarity.</p> <p>Children have benefitted in all areas of the curriculum by being able to use strategies to deal with emotions.</p> <p>Positive feedback from children who enjoy ‘smart moves’ sessions. Children have developed listening, gross motor skills and confidence; this has supported their learning in other areas of the curriculum.</p>

Primarily, this will focus on core subjects. Part of the cost will cover preparation and planning time to ensure the best possible intervention. Resources can be obtained to act as a stimulus, eg texts to inspire reading.</p> <p>Each Key stage has an LSA whose time will be partly spent supporting PPG children in small support groups or 1:1 sessions. These sessions will predominantly focus on phonics, reading and writing.</p> <p>Staff training will include INSET and staff meetings. Improvement of first quality teaching through team teach approach and sharing of ideas/resources. Also specific TA training focusing on learning.</p> <p>SENCO / Headteacher will lead PPG planning. Monitoring will be done through discussions with team leaders, LSAs and by attending termly pupil progress meetings. Discussions about children will always feature on agendas for each team meeting.</p>	<p>Impact on progress. Progress measured out of the 17 children with data:</p> <p>59% achieved expected /good progress (3 stages) in all of reading, writing and maths across the year.</p> <p>12% achieved expected/good progress (3 stages) in 2 out of reading, writing and maths.</p> <p>Our knowledge of the new curriculum is comprehensive, which allows us to encourage creativity through learning.</p> <p>TAs have used elements of their learning in teams; they lead support groups to develop key objectives in reading, writing or maths. Effective use of new assessment system to support learning.</p> <p>92% of lessons are good or above.</p>
