Primarily, this will focus on core subjects. Part of the cost will cover preparation and planning time to ensure the best possible intervention. Resources can be obtained to act as a stimulus, eg texts to inspire reading.</p> <p>Each Key stage has an LSA whose time will be partly spent supporting PPG children in small support groups or 1:1 sessions. These sessions will predominantly focus on phonics, reading and writing.</p> <p>Staff training will include INSET and staff meetings. Improvement of first quality teaching through team teach approach and sharing of ideas/resources. Training will also be provided by the FTP. Also specific TA training focusing on learning.</p> <p>Deputy Headteacher will lead PPG. Monitoring will be done through discussions with team leaders, SENCO, LSAs and by attending termly pupil progress meetings (both SENCO and Deputy Headteacher attend all meetings). Discussions about children will always feature on agendas for each team meeting.
